A Message from the President

At long last the Bus Restoration Project appears to be entering the final lap. The step now underway is the mounting and welding of the bus body onto its chasis. Afterward the bus will move through the final stages of sheet metal and insulation installation, then on to installing window glass, flooring, seats and upholstery, body paint, and completion of the instrument panel and interior.



The garage we rented to work on the bus indoors during the winter months is relinquished as the bus moves to Kustom Auto Body in Coaldale.

The Board expresses deep appreciation and commendation to Lanny Aitkens in recognition of his numerous months of volunteer work on the bus. Quite a few of the chasis parts were not available so Lanny handcrafted the parts himself. We are blessed to have him working on the bus.

We are diligently pursuing every lead looking for land and a building for storage for the bus when restoration is completed.

The Society has contracted with McLarty Consulting, a Lethbridge firm owned by Jeff McLarty to launch a fund raising drive for the purpose of raising funds for the Society purchasing the Galt #8 Mine Site, which has been for sale for approximately $3\frac{1}{2}$ years. As a side note, McLarty spearheaded a campaign last year which raised over one million dollars to outfit the new library branch in West Lethbridge. The Society is pleased to receive the services of such a talented and energetic professional.

A "Tribute to Miners" second Annual Memorial Banquet held on Saturday, April 30th at the Nord-Bridge Seniors Hall was a superb evening enjoyed by a sellout attendance. At least nine miners attended the banquet and were recognized as the heros of the event: Frank Toth of Coaldale; Andrew Veres of Coalhurst; Paul Szoke of Kipp; Blaine Dow, Mike Dikun, Fred Egger, Julius Kovacs, Charles Wesselman, and Les Toth of Lethbridge, all of whom are very supportive of


